



FRONT VIEW.




RIGHT SIDE VIEW.

\$500 from each US delegate’s program fees will be directed toward the costs of library construction, providing a total of \$10,000 from the 20 US delegates. The remainder of the library costs will be covered through fundraising and in-kind donation.

Youth for Technology Foundation, a US-based nonprofit devoted to providing opportunities in technology for youth in Nigeria, has agreed to donate the following for the Oporoza library:

- 10 computers
- Library management software
- Assistance with creation of a ‘digital village’
- Assorted books

The village of Oporoza will be providing in-kind donations of labor and locally-sourced materials for the library. In addition, the village has arranged and paid for the architect who designed the library building. Library construction will begin in late August, during the planning visit of Susan Partnow and Mary Ella Keblusek. Construction will continue through November, with a combination of skilled labor and local volunteers. The Global Citizen Journey delegation will work with the local volunteers to provide finishing touches (painting, landscaping, arranging furnishings, sorting and arranging books) during their visit in November. A grand opening ceremony is scheduled for the last week of November, which will be attended by government officials, media and many residents in the riverine area.
